## GIVING TO TEMPLE SOLEL WITH YOUR IRA

There are two easy ways to use your IRA to make gifts to Temple Solel. Seniors over age 70 ½ can make tax free charitable contributions if they act before December 31, 2011.

Everyone else can make a wonderful planned gift by designating Temple Solel as one of the beneficiaries of their IRA account. You can use your IRA account to take care of your loved ones and the Temple.

## TAX-FREE “ROLLOVERS” FROM IRAS

IRA owners aged 70 ½ or older may make a direct payment from their IRA to the Temple. Their generosity allows them to share their IRA assets without first counting the distribution as personal income and without paying income tax on the distribution. For those who would rather donate to the Temple than pay taxes, this is a wonderful win-win.

For some, the annual mandatory IRA distribution may increase current income, possibly making social security income taxable, or increasing their tax bracket if combined social security and other income are already taxable. This is in addition to the income tax on the IRA distribution itself. This charitable directed distribution counts toward the minimum required distribution and can eliminate that taxable income problem.

### Qualifications:

1. You must be at least 70 ½ years of age when the gift is transferred.
2. Total gifts cannot exceed \$100,000 per year per IRA owner.
3. Gifts must be made directly from your IRA to a public charity (e.g. Temple Solel), and cannot be made to a private foundation, a supporting organization or a donor advised fund.
4. The gifts must be outright.
5. The gifts can only be made during 2011 (unless the legislation is extended further).

When the above qualifications are met, the money is not included in the IRA owner's income and, most importantly, is not taxed. This law is scheduled to expire after this year unless Congress acts to extend it.

## DESIGNATING THE TEMPLE AS A BENEFICIARY

Every IRA owner may designate one or more beneficiaries to receive their IRA when they pass away. Owners may designate loved ones or a cherished organization like Temple Solel. Your gift to the temple can be a specific amount or a percentage. If you include Temple Solel in your beneficiary designation and notify the Temple, you will be included in the Temple Legacy Circle.

Please consider taking advantage of this wonderful opportunity to support our current programs or leave a permanent legacy to help Temple Solel thrive. Make the gift of a lifetime.
